## **36<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL YELLOW SPRINGS ART SHOW IS A FAMILY EVENT**

### **CHESTER SPRINGS, PA**

From April 25 through May 10 the 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Yellow Springs Art Show and Sale will fill the galleries in the Lincoln Building with paintings, drawings and sculptures by more than 170 professional artists. Among those will be Jane M. Price Kraniski of Elverson PA and her son, Brent Logan of Douglassville, PA. This will be the first time in the show's history that a mother and son have exhibited together.

Kraniski was apprenticed to the nationally recognized Russian portrait artist, John Teyral after receiving a BFA in painting from Cleveland Institute of Art and Case Western Reserve University. She has worked as an illustrator for several art agencies and established her own portrait studio. Kraniski's work has been seen in numerous shows and exhibitions in the US and Europe. Her work was selected for purchase by the Cleveland Art Association. In addition to teaching painting and drawing, she is the recipient of several awards and scholarships. Her entries in the Yellow Springs show will be pastels and charcoal.

Brent Logan is a self-taught artist with a passion for all things equine and works in all media. This will be one of his first public showings as he just recently turned 20 years of age. When not pursuing his art, he is currently a level 3 Parelli Natural Horse-Man-Ship specializing in the English Discipline. He is also Head Horseman and Manager of Wellsprings Farm Welsh Ponies.

Adding to this year's show will be several activities that involve the audience. "Art Quest for Kids" will run throughout the length of the show and will encourage young viewers to search for clues hidden in the paintings as they sharpen their observational skills and vie for prizes. *Images of Yellow Springs* will be a special exhibit in the lobby of the Lincoln Building that will be up throughout the show.

*The Arts of Yellow Springs* will be a one day arts emersion program for adults with lectures, hands-on art experiences, a box lunch, showing of the Country School video, tour of Painted Sites Trail and guided tour of the galleries. Limited to 20 adults, this is an opportunity to fully understand the role the village of Yellow Springs continues to play in America's art scene.

The 36<sup>th</sup> Yellow Springs Art Show is open free to the public from April 25 through May 10 with show hours 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Fridays.
