

# Lunchtime Lecture at Historic Yellow Springs

**November 6, 2008 - Chester Springs, PA - HISTORIC YELLOW SPRINGS HOSTS LUNCHTIME LECTURE**

**“The Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts: A History Seen through Its Archival Treasures”** will be presented as the first in a series of lunchtime lectures. At 12 noon on November 12, 2008. Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts (PAFA) Archivist, Cheryl Leibold will discuss images from the Academy’s historical materials preserved in the PAFA archives. Included will be archival documents, photographs and printed materials that reflect the history of America’s oldest art museum and school.

A portion of the lecture will be devoted to images of the Country School at Chester Springs, which was an integral part of PAFA’s program from 1916 to 1952. Leibold will discuss both the social life and studio activities of artists during that era.

This lecture is presented in conjunction with FLUXspace Gallery’s *Project Portal* on display through November 22 and is supported in part by The Pew Center for Arts and Heritage through Heritage Philadelphia Program.
