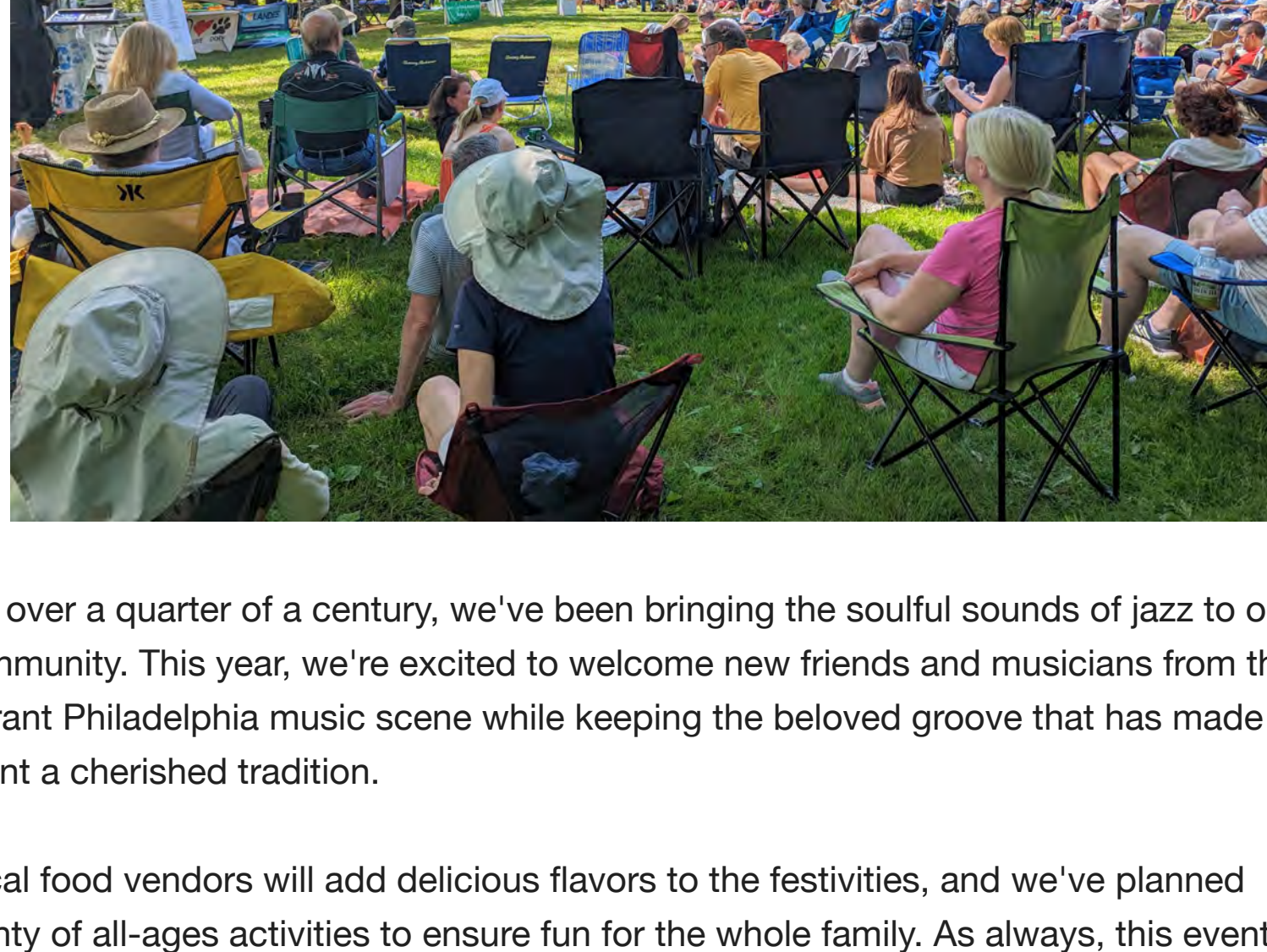


Join us for Jazz at the Springs

The story continues as we discover how Connie Fraley's relentless dedication helped establish Historic Yellow Springs and transformed it into the vibrant village it is today.

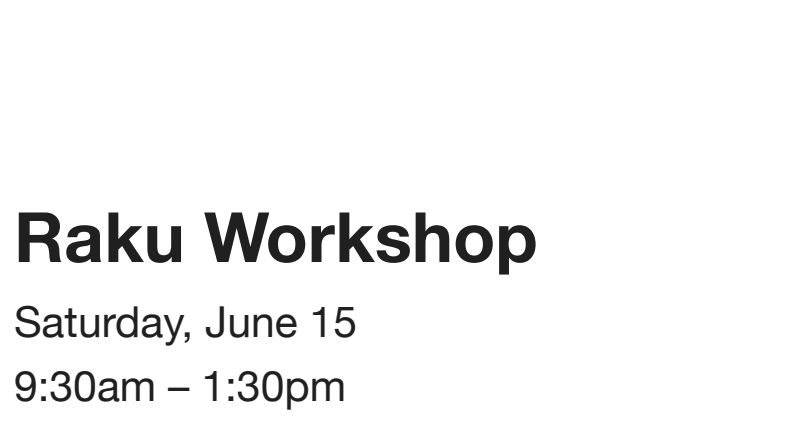
From purchasing key properties to creating art programs, Connie's vision and hard work were instrumental in overcoming numerous challenges.

May was national preservation month



MAY : NATIONAL PRESERVATION MONTH

"People Saving Places" was the theme for the 2024 May celebration of preservation in America. There are over 100,000 places listed on the National Register of Historic Places and we, at Historic Yellow Springs, are proud to be part of that significant number. These sites connect us to the past, anchor us to the present and lead us into the future.

As Historic Yellow Springs continues to celebrate its 50th anniversary in 2024, we are pleased to continue the preservation of our village dating to 1722. Our founders were indeed People Saving Places as expressed its mission to preserve this village. They stated the following goals:

1. Acquire the Yellow Springs Spa property to insure the preservation of buildings and surrounding grounds.
2. Establish and implement a program for the restoration of the buildings.
3. Preserve for open space and recreation uses of the lands that surround the village.
4. Create a center for the encouragement of activities and programs related to history and the arts, the conservation of cultural heritage and the nurture of an aesthetic and physical environment.

Over the 50 years, those goals have been met and continue to guide us as we move forward. All the historic structures have been restored and maintenance continues to keep them stable. In a village as old as HYS, it is an on-going task. Recently, the Poolhouse was stabilized as a local Eagle Scout project working with Executive Director Tim Compton.

Tim will be sharing with you our current preservation project which is the rehabilitation of Connie's House to include expanding our studio space for art classes. Be sure to read his story in the next e-News issue.

As we save and preserve our sites, we as an organization tell America's story and build strong communities. We are preserving the past and protecting our future. And all of you are part of this preservation effort as you volunteer your time and talent to our events and activities and provide financial support with your generous gifts. It is all needed and deeply appreciated. You are saving places.
